Councillor Rhys Jordan January 2024 Report for St Florence & St Mary Out Liberty

A New Year's Greeting

First and foremost, I wish to convey my heartfelt New Year greetings to all residents in our

community.

Concerning the River Ritec Flooding

Once again, our community has been adversely affected by the River Ritec's flooding, marking the

second "risk to life" flood warning within a mere 60 days. The consequential closure of the B4318 at

Gumfreston Causeway and significant inundation of Treflyone Lane and Marsh Road have isolated St

Florence and its environs. I have proactively reached out to Councillor David Simpson, Leader of

Pembrokeshire County Council, demanding prompt and decisive action. Unfortunately, with the shift

in weather patterns, such events might become more frequent. I am scheduled to meet with

representatives from Natural Resources Wales (NRW) on the 11th of January 2024 to deliberate on

long-term countermeasures, which, though financially demanding, are critically necessary.

Collaborative efforts with Sam Kurtz MS are underway to ensure our residents' voices are heard in the

Senedd.

Issues on Devonshire Drive and Eastern Lane

Residents have raised concerns over the damage to hedgerows and verges along Devonshire Drive

and Eastern Lane, largely due to the increased traffic volume caused by detours from the flooding.

This issue has been reported to the highways team, and I am hoping for expedient repairs.

Persistent Flooding in New Hedges

The lane linking the village of New Hedges with the shared use footpath on the New Hedges bypass

is subject to chronic flooding. Additionally, the persistent issue of dog fouling in this area cannot be

overlooked. Discussions with the appropriate team at the Pembrokeshire County Council (PCC) are in

progress to explore the installation of effective drainage systems and to request more stringent

monitoring for dog fouling and littering.

Pembrokeshire County Council's Financial Challenges

The Pembrokeshire County Council is grappling with a considerable financial deficit, estimated at about £28.4 million. This predicament will likely necessitate substantial council tax increases. In my view, it is imperative that we refocus on providing statutory services such as education, social care, and housing, and reconsider our spending priorities. The impending increases in premiums for second and empty homes are a necessary measure, yet I caution against an excessive 300% premium

on second homes, which may be counterproductive.

Community Litter Picking Initiatives

A heartfelt thank you to our dedicated litter pickers, who tirelessly work to keep our ward pristine. I plan to organise additional community litter picks as the days grow longer. I encourage everyone to participate and contribute to these communal efforts.
